*** Musical Freestyle Entries ***

USEF Freestyle Rule : A photocopy of a test verifying eligibility (minimum score of **60%** in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF recognized show) **must be submitted with the entry** for a freestyle class.

Sound Check opportunities will be available prior to start of the show and during breaks prior to scheduled freestyle classes. **Bring a back-up** copy of music.

*** Dressage Whips - Maximum Length 47.2 inches (120 cm) ***

(Very) Tentative Schedule of Classes :

USEF requires that a tentative class schedule be included in the prize list. It follows. **Be Advised** that the actual scheduling will depend on several factors including, but not limited to **heat** (upper level rides will go earlier), competitors riding more than one horse, horses being shown by more than one rider, coaches working with multiple horses and students, distances competitors travel, and special needs. In general, the Secretary will attempt to schedule your rides lower test to higher, 30 to 45 minutes apart (50 if riding 2 horses) so one warm-up will do if possible, or enough time to truly rest the horse between warm-ups if not. **If you have special needs or requests for scheduling, Please include a note!** I'll do what I can to accommodate you.

Opportunity Classes

These Training 1 & 2 and First 1 & 2 Classes are offered for people who want to try out a Recognized Show without having to incur the expense of USEF and USDF Membership and Horse fees. There are two Divisions: Jr/YR and Open. The Open Division is for both amateurs and professional adult riders. (If we had an Adult Amateur Division amateurs would have to pay for a \$30 USEF Amateur Card.) Entrants in Opportunity Classes may cross-enter into Regular classes but then must meet Membership and Horse ID number requirements.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Injury or Illness of a Horse on Competition Grounds

In the event of an acute and/or serious injury to or illness of a horse on competition grounds when the owner or trainer of the horse or agent of the owner is not present, after reasonable effort to contact that individual has been made competition management, in consultation with a licensed equine veterinarian, may authorize the provision of emergency veterinary treatment of the horse. If competition management so authorizes treatment, competition management and the veterinarian are not liable for any resulting costs, damages, losses, claims or actions arising directly or indirectly from the treatment of the horse.

GENERAL RULES OF THE SHOW

Tentative Start Time : 9:00 A.M.

Show will be held regardless of weather ; rides will be delayed if lightening occurs.

1. **Every Class Offered Herein Which Is Covered By The Rules And Specifications Of The Current USEF Rule Book Will Be Conducted And Judged In Accordance Therewith.** Participants are responsible for knowing the rules.
2. **Show Management reserves the right** to limit entries; to add, split, cancel, and/or combine classes; to add/change officials and arenas; to add or cancel awards and prizes and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed; to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management.
3. **To Show in USDF Intro & Opportunity Classes :** No Rider, Owner, Trainer, Coach Memberships or Horse ID Numbers are Required (unless you also enter Regular classes). **USDF Intro Level Classes** are open to Amateur and Junior/Young Riders. Others may show in these classes riding hors de concours. Intro Level entrants must not have shown above Training Level, may not show above Training 2 at this show. Opportunity Class entrants may also enter Regular classes.
4. **To Show in Regular Classes : USEF: Rider, horse Owner, Trainer** (adult person responsible for the horse on the show grounds), and, if applicable, **Coach** (adult person receiving remuneration for teaching, instructing, schooling the Rider at the show) must show **proof of USEF Competing Membership**, or pay a \$30 non-member fee or join at the show. Exempt : citizens of other countries who show proof of membership in good standing of their national federations. **USDF: Rider and horse Owner must show proof of Group, Participating, or Intercollegiate USDF Membership** (Owner may be a Business Member), or complete and pay \$5 affidavit fee, or pay a \$25 non-member fee or join at the show. **The Horse** needs a USDF Registration or ID number or apply at show & may have USEF Recording.
5. **To Enter Great American/ USDF Qualifying Class :** Rider and horse Owner must be USEF Competing Member and USDF Participating Member (Owner may be a Business Member) or apply at show. Horse must have USEF Recording, USDF Registration or apply at show.
6. **Each Competitor** is responsible for supplying correct USEF and USDF numbers or scores may not count toward national awards. Names of people and horse must match membership verifications. Riders entering **Jr/YR** classes must supply **birth date** on Entry Form and must be **less than 21 years of age as of January 1, 2012**. **Adult Amateurs** must provide proof of USEF Amateur status with Entry or **enter Open classes**, except USDF Intro Classes.
7. **Signature** of Rider, Owner, Trainer (mandatory), Coach (if applicable) is **required on the Entry Agreement** even if the same person. **Minors** (under 18) : parent/guardian signs and prints name in "Parent/Guardian" section. Print minor's name as Rider &/or Owner, but **parent/guardian signs** on signature line. If minor is trainer, print minor's name, parent/guardian signs and writes "(parent)" on signature line. USEF, USDF membership **not** required for parent/guardian signing for a minor.
8. **Horse Health :** Proof of **negative Coggins within the last 12 months** is required for each horse brought to the Show Grounds. Failure to provide such proof will result in elimination, removal of the horse, and no return of fees. Any horse that appears to have developed a communicable disease may be required to leave the grounds at Management's discretion. Competition Management is not responsible for the health of horses on the grounds. Owners enter horses at their own risk.
9. **Tests :** Current USEF Dressage Tests (2011) , USDF Introductory Tests (2011), and USDF Musical Freestyle Tests (2011) will be used.
10. **Sharps Container :** Located in the stabling area. Needles and other sharp instruments must be disposed of in the "sharps" container .
10. **Great American/USDF & SWDC Qualifying Classes** will run concurrently with the corresponding non-qualifying classes and will not be pinned separately.
12. **Ribbons** will be awarded through sixth place. No Awards Ceremonies are planned.
13. **Returned check fee \$35.**
14. **Arenas : Competition Arena** is a 20x60 m covered arena with clay base, sand and rubber chip top footing. Intro, Training 1&2 Classes **may** be ridden in a 20x40m arena. All others will be ridden in a 20 x 60 arena. **Warm-Up areas** are grass and include a large field with longeing and riding areas, a grass 20x60 m practice arena. **Longeing** allowed in designated, taped off and posted area only.
15. **Closing Date :** Entries must be **Postmarked by Monday, March 19, 2012**.
16. **Late Entries and Changes** after closing date will be accepted if feasible and will be assessed a Late/Change Fee of \$15.00 per entry or change.
17. **Refunds : Before Closing Date:** All fees except office fee will be refunded for horses or riders unable to compete for physical reasons as verified by a vet or physician certificate. **Between** Closing Date and 9 AM Thursday before the show these fees will be refunded with vet or physician certificate **AND** if ride times can be filled. **No Refunds for cancellations after 9 AM Thursday before the show. If Show is canceled** due to weather or other calamity all but office fee will be refunded; **if rescheduled** same will apply for those who cannot attend new date.
18. **Ride Times :** Tentative ride times available from Secretary after noon on the Wednesday before the show. Competitors may call the Show Secretary for tentative ride times. RIDERS will be notified of tentative ride times by phone, e-mail, or mail by the Thursday before the show. **Ride Times** will be posted on the show grounds by 12:00 P.M. the day before the show. Upon arrival on show grounds check with the Secretary regarding any alterations in the schedule of rides.
19. **Schooling :** the show grounds will be available for schooling after Noon on the day before the show. The competition arena will be closed at 6 PM for final set-up.
20. **Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 18 and over while on horses that are competing only in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test).**
21. **Bridle number** will be issued, must be worn by the horse when out of stall or trailer.
22. **Non-Competing Horses** may come to the grounds for show environment experience **If Space Allows** (call Secretary), entry form and waiver are completed, Coggins requirements are met, and Office fee, Grounds/Stabling fee, and Non-Competing Horse fee are paid. Longeing / riding of this horse is allowed if done by the designated handler and without interfering with competitors.
23. **Children** must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times. **Dogs** are allowed on grounds if friendly, are leashed **AND** in hand **OR** kenneled at all times. Owner is responsible for damage resulting from their dog's behavior.

***** Special Prizes *****

USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal : Open to all USEF Adult Amateurs with USDF Group or Participating Membership riding Second Level Test 3. The highest scoring eligible rider (minimum score 60 %) will win a pewter medal neck ribbon and, for the first 3 wins in a competition year, a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate. Winners of 3 USDF/Dover Medal classes in a single competition year receive a USDF/Dover National Merit Award. The USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The Champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate, the Reserve Champion a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate.

Motorcycles and off-road motorized vehicles other than mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are not allowed on competition grounds

Motorized Vehicle Statement

In accordance with GR 1301.7:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Attention Competitors

Each Competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider and trainer, before the first day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

2012 Great American Insurance Group/ USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year.

The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2012 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (PM* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at

USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

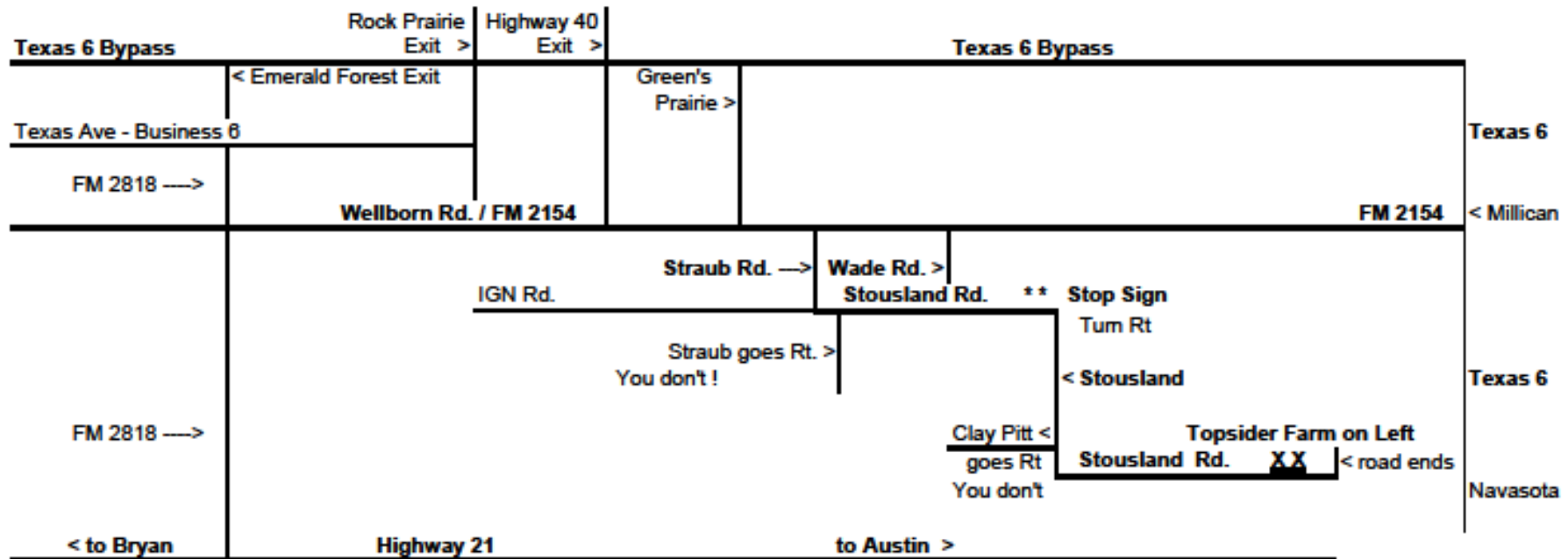
Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
